JUNIOR INTERCLUBS: 2nd TUESDAY OF AUGUST

General rules for junior interclubs

Player eligibility

A player can represent only one club in the Montreal Regional Association. The term "player" includes boys and girls aged 18 and under as of August 1st of the year. To be part of an interclub team, a player must be a member in good standing of his club and a member of Golf Quebec associated with his club. (No public golfer). The team captain provides the list of his players within the prescribed time frame (July 31 of the current year).

Rules of competition

Clubs are grouped into sections. The competition includes singles matches (game by hole) or games in Stableford. Each team will be made up of the number of players prescribed per group. The current golf rules are those of three-ball games (rule 21.4 Three balls and definitions as well as Rule 21.1, Stableford) and those indicated on the notice given to competitors. All official decisions are final. Players who arrive late will be penalized under Rule 5.3a. All rules of the competition must be made at the meeting with the team captains before the tournament. (Local rules and competition)

Competition schedule

The competition takes place on the course of the host club, which will be able to use the type of starts it will want for the Stableford and Matchplay competition. **The last departure can at no time be later than 1:00 p.m.**

Motorized or electric carts as well as caddys are not permitted.

PENALTY DISQUALIFICATION

Captain or Team Leader: Only the team manager or team captain can give advice.

Distance measuring devices are allowed.

Dress Code: The wearing of Bermuda is permitted in accordance with the host club's regulations, which are priority and in force.

Host Club Responsibilities: The host club is responsible for preparing the course, but the director in charge of the competition has the final say. It is suggested for optimal playing time, to have a course at a maximum of 6200 yards or less for the junior class. When the playing conditions do not allow the summer rule, it is mandatory to use the relief of a club length.

PENALTY, LOSS OF THE HOLE

Slow play: It is the responsibility of the Host Club and the referee (if present) to ensure that the competition runs smoothly. The host club will be responsible for managing playing time. In this management, the host club will have to use a method that is according to golf rules and the rules of game time method of Golf Quebec.



Match Play Formula Gr. 1 to 6

****Groups from 1 to 3:**

8 players and 2 substitutes, no obligation or age limit

****For groups from 4 to 6:**

6 players and 2 substitutes, no obligation or age limit.

Points: Each golfer must play, in hole competition, against the other three, and each player has one (2) points for each win and (1) point for each tie, and none (0) for each defeat.

Tiebreaker: In the event of a tie between two or more teams, the following formula applies: The final result must be determined by the total points, against each other of the clubs involved, in all matches. In the event that the clubs are still tied, the total points in the actual count of each member of the team in question, will be compared against each other, starting with players with the lowest handicap factors, according to the method "result until equality is broken.

Ranking: The winning team in a section climbs one step up and moves to the higher group, the following year. The club that ranks last goes directly to the lower section. The club that finishes second in its section becomes the host club the following year unless it has received in previous years. This rule does not apply in the event of a club withdrawal. In such a case, Golf Quebec reserves the right to determine which club will become the host club, the first will give way to the second and if there was withdrawal of the second, the club having finished third will have to receive, etc.

Cancellation / Stoppage: In the case of a suspension of play caused by bad weather or any other factor that requires and the competition remains unfinished, the counting method will be made as follows: All foursomes have completed 9 holes. The compilation is done on the first nine holes. The foursome did not complete 9 holes. The ranking of the teams remains unchanged and the host club rises to the higher group while the last club goes directly to the lower level.

Transmission of results:

After the competition the results must be sent within two days to the manager via email, along with the Excel form.

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Stableford Formula Gr. 7 and 8

On the fifteenth (15th) of July each year, the manager registers his team in the group of his choice, except the host club that must remain in the same group.

Each team is made up of 4 players.

No age obligation. (No substitutes)

One week before the competition, the host club receives the list of teams, players and makes its draw of departures according to its availability, Shotgun, Cross-Over or regular Tee Time

Points Allowance: Modified Stableford. The points collected in Stableford game are compiled according to the prescribed number per group.

The 2 best scores out of 4 are counted

Double bogey*:	1 point
Bogey :	2 points
Par:	3 points
Birdie :	4 points
Eagle:	5 points

Group 7: 6 teams of 4 players.

Group 8: 6 teams of 4 players.

***When a player has reached his double bogey limit, he picks up his ball and becomes available at the next hole.**

Tie breaker: In the event of a tie, the points collected on the basis of the last nine, last 6 holes and last 3 holes between the teams involved and the scores selected. The team finishing first climbs into the top group. (But may remain in groups 7 and 8 if he wishes).

And the last team goes down to the lower group.

Ranking and downgrade: When registered on July 1 of each year, a club may outperform or downgrade to the Stableford or Match Play categories

Cancellation / Stoppage: In the case of a cancellation, bad temperature etc., the competition will be valid, if all players have played at least nine holes, regardless of the method of departures.

Transmission of results:

After the competition the results must be sent within two days to the manager via email, along with the Excel form.

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
